

## From Revd Janet

Dear Friends,

At last summery weather is here and everyone is outside: what a relief after such a wet spring and early summer. I love to hear the local children playing in their gardens when we sit outside in ours. It is truly a sign that the summer holidays are here, and we all unwind for a while. The Hall Trustees met this week to consider the future of the Hall Management, having received a letter from Tony Masters tendering his resignation from that position at the end of September. This gives us some time to make other arrangements. The Trustees extend our thanks to Tony for managing the Hall for about 3 years or so (well, before I arrived!) He has dealt with the day-to-day booking and running, as well as those mishaps and problems which occur when one has responsibility for a building used by groups of different people. We thank Christine, too, as she often answered the phone and relayed messages and inquiries.

Who are the Trustees? The Priest in Charge, the Churchwardens, the Dean of Stamford, and the Marquis of Exeter. Generally, the last two are not consulted about day-to-day issues. The Dean of Stamford is now Mark Warrick, funnily enough. The Marquis of Exeter lives in Canada, but has representatives from the Burghley estate if necessary.

The immediate issue is whether or not the time has come to pay a caretaker/manager an honorarium, rather than expecting volunteers to do it. We will be considering the best course of action - watch this space for more news.

In the meantime, we thought it would be interesting to receive old photos or items of interest concerning the history of the hall. I have a photo of the Marquis and a priest at the dedication of the 1960 extension. I will be bringing it along to Church to see who knows the identity of the Vicar - or is it a Bishop?

#### Just a reminder .....

In September we shall begin a slightly different pattern of worship: on the first Sunday of the month there will be a 9 o'clock said Communion (Common Worship) followed by a 10 o'clock All Age Service, which will sometimes include Baptism, and a 6 pm Choral Evensong. The second and fourth Sundays will continue as at present with an 8 o'clock said Communion (BCP) and a 10 o'clock Sung Eucharist. The third Sunday will continue to have a 10 o'clock Sung Eucharist with an afternoon Baptism Service at 3 pm. When there is a fifth Sunday, there will be a 10 o'clock Sung Eucharist.

## Cooking with Margaret Cauliflower Gratin



Ingredients:	Method	d:
1 Medium-large Cauliflower trimmed and cut into florets	1.	Bring a saucepan of Salted water to the boil, add the Cauliflower and cook for 5 minutes or until only just tender.
<ul><li>40g Butter</li><li>1 Large Onion peeled and sliced</li></ul>	2.	Meanwhile, melt 15g of the butter in a saucepan and cook the onions and mushrooms for 5 minutes.
110g Mushrooms wiped and halved	3.	Drain the cooked cauliflower and place in a flameproof dish with the onions and mushrooms and add the chopped egg.
<ul><li>2 large Eggs hard boiled roughly chopped</li><li>25g Plain Flour</li></ul>	4.	Melt the remaining butter in a saucepan and stir in the flour. Add the milk and bring to the boil stirring until smooth. Add half of the cheese and stir until melted. Remove from heat and stir in the yogurt
300ml Milk	5.	and sweetcorn.  Pour the sauce evenly over the vegetables. Mix the
75g Double Gloucester Cheese	J.	remaining cheese with the breadcrumbs and sprinkle over the sauce.
175g Sweetcorn kernels	6.	Heat the grill to moderate. Place the cauliflower gratin under the grill and cook until golden brown
<ul><li>150g Natural Yogurt</li><li>25g Fresh Breadcrumbs</li></ul>		and bubbling hot, reducing the heat as required to prevent the cheese and breadcrumbs from burning.
